## French glyphosate-based pesticide ban positive but insufficient

Brussels, 7 May, 2025

Following the decision of a French Administrative Court of Appeal to cancel the renewal of two glyphosate-based products, SAFE states its support for the content of the ruling but regrets that it will not make a tangible difference for consumers, due to gaps in EU regulation.

**Deputy director Luigi Tozzi said:** "Although we support this ruling, the current EU regulation on pesticides, sadly, leaves no room for optimism. Food production using glyphosate-based pesticides can be sold everywhere in the internal market, because member states have discretion over pesticide use in their countries. This creates a vulnerability in the food chain, even in the countries that have decided to ban glyphosate."

SAFE has always advocated for a ban of glyphosate in the EU — a "probable carcinogen", according to the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) — and stood against its re-approval in 2023, a decision based on old rules of risk assessment, and lacking a dietary risk assessment for consumers.

**Luigi Tozzi said:** "Member states can still invoke derogations even for banned pesticides, claiming 'exceptional circumstances'. This is a loophole and it needs to be corrected."

SAFE believes these legal gaps are in contradiction with the aims of the Sustainable Use Regulation (SUR), a part of the European Green New Deal, aiming to reduce the use and risk of chemical pesticides by 50% in 2030.

The appeal in front of the French court was carried by Générations Futures, a member of Pesticide Action Network Europe.
